

A Note from our pastor Dr. Steve Smith....

Question #1: What is your very first memory of church? Question #2: What is your first memory of being confused in church? My answer to questions #1 and #2 are actually the same. My first memory of church is of my mother playing the organ. My first memory of being confused at church relates to my Mom's organ playing. My mother typically took two pairs of shoes to church, one pair to wear when she wasn't playing the organ, and one pair to wear when she was playing the organ. You see, playing a church organ typically means you are playing pedals with your feet, while also playing keys with your fingers (an amazing feat, if you ask me.) In order to play organ pedals with your feet, you have to wear somewhat narrow shoes, which explains why my mother typically took two pairs of shoes to church on Sundays. My earliest memory of being confused at church is: "Hey, why is Mom taking two pairs of shoes to church? Should I be taking two pairs of shoes too? Is taking two pairs of shoes a "church-thing?"

Of course, over the ensuing years, and even to this present day, there are still "church-things" that are confusing. Over the years I've heard questions such as: "How can God be 3-in-one?" (Trinity) "Why do we do a Call to Worship?" "What is the meaning of communion?" "Why do the colors change (vestments) in the sanctuary?" More significantly, "Why do bad things happen to good people?" "Where was God when I was suffering?"

As human beings, there are likely questions that won't be fully answered in this lifetime. After all, if we understood all matters related to God and church, we would be on the same level as God. And yet, we *can* find answers together. In fact, I find fellowship, strength, inspiration, and yes....fun in finding answers together when I'm part of an inquisitive church family.

What are your questions? What confuses you about your faith experience, God and church? Being part of a church means companionship. Being part of a church family means asking questions and working to discover answers together.

Let's learn together! Let's gather in-person and online in the New Year to learn, laugh, and discover together. And of course, I am very happy to speak with you privately if you'd like to toss around questions and answers together. Just let me know. Pastor Steve

Most of us will be pleased to bid 2023 farewell. While for many folks it has been a quiet year, for others it has been a year wrought with worry, uncertainly and illness. For me personally it has been a time of adventure, clutter clearing and reflection. As I cleared some of the clutter that had accumulated since my move into my new home, I took some trips down memory lane as I looked through and sorted lots of photos. I found items that I hadn't displayed or used for many years and my goal now will be to organize and store away the things I most want to keep and toss the rest hopefully making for a new and organized look and easy accessibility of the things I need to find quickly. I have also spent quite a bit of time reflecting and reminiscing about my trip out west. I had the time of my life!

My reality is very different from that of many others like those who must work remotely or those on the front lines of the pandemic battle. There are those who were and continue to be without work due to layoffs or shut-downs, those who visit or care for a parent with dementia, or those who care for a loved one who is receiving hospice There are those who have to try to stay dry or warm while living outside, or worry about how they will feed, house and care for themselves and their families. It is so easy to be complacent when you are comfortable, safe and warm!

2024 is upon us. It will be a year that sees new leadership in our nation's capital. In the new year the pandemic will not yet be behind us and more difficult days will be coming. It will see despair, defeat, hate-mongering, gun violence, wars around the world, and even more hunger and homelessness. It may also be a year of renewed caring-concern, peace and love. It can easily become more of the same or can become a year full of hope, promise and gratitude. The new year is a new opportunity and *it will be what we make it*! Having faith and walking with God can get us through anything!

It will oft seem impossible to convince people to have hope. Many of their situations preclude an attitude of just the opposite. It will be up to us to work together to make a difference for those who are feeling lost, uncared for and hopeless. We can make a difference working through our church family and through local organizations such as Faith Linking in Action and other groups whose sole purpose is to improve the situations of those who have little voice. It will be up to those of us who feel hopeful to reach out and care for those who feel only hopelessness and to pray for insight so that we not miss the need around us.

As Pastor Steve so often says... "Our best days are ahead of us!" There are many scriptures that let you know that God is always with us and that bring words of hope such as these from Philippians 4: 6-7... "Don't worry about anything; instead, pray about everything. Tell God what you need, and thank him for all he has done. Then you will experience God's peace, which exceeds anything we can understand. His peace will guard your hearts and minds as you live in Christ Jesus." Let's fill 2024 with hope & gratitude!
